The overall Tri-County numbers are not exactly the numbers that were released for 2013. The Family Resource Center of Warm Springs did not participate in the count this year and therefore the only place those numbers are included, are in the orange section of the Warm Springs breakout.

The most alarming change is the increase in Chronic Homeless numbers: 256 (2013) to 522 (2014). To be considered chronically homeless the individual must be 18+ years of age, have a disability & have been homeless for the past 12+ months or have had 4 episodes of homelessness in the past 3 years. Every community experienced an increase in this number.

Potential reasons behind this increase include: 1. the volunteers administering the survey are becoming more familiar with the process and receiving training each year to improve collection results, 2. Mental health and disabilities are becoming less taboo and people are more open to sharing their disabilities, 3. individuals are remaining in their situations longer (12+ months)
